<p>These & other questions should also be asked sufficiently early when on the move to ensure the student <u>will</u> carry out correctly the specific action ahead.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. What pair of mirrors do you need to check before giving a signal? 2. How do you judge where to position the car when turning left and why? 3. How do you judge when to start turning the steering wheel when turning left? 4. How do you judge where to position yourself in relation to the centre line when turning right? 5. What speed would you be at two car lengths from a right angled left turn? 6. What effective observations should be carried out before turning into the new road? 7. How can you judge when it is safe to proceed across oncoming traffic on a right turn? 8. What is the danger of cutting the centre line in the new road when turning right off a major road? 9.
